Decorate your own Easter baskets

Get crafty and decorate Easter baskets for the children to collect their eggs in. Stock up on supplies, including cute chicks, ribbon and stickers and let their imaginations run wild! It's a good idea to do this on Good Friday or Easter Saturday to build egg-citement and make the organisation fun for all.

Use colour coding

Make the hunt more of a challenge by introducing colour coding. For example, finding a green egg is worth two points and score five points with a blue egg. The Hide and Squeak[®] Eggs are a great option as the bright colours make them easy for children to spot and can be reused year after year.

Plant a golden egg

Make it suitable for all age ranges

Make sure no one gets all the eggs to themselves by making the hunt fair for all ages. Remember, younger children may not be able to see what you can, so make sure the eggs are low enough for them to get their hands on.
